Dear Friends of St Theosevia's,

Welcome to a new academic year and the new Michaelmas Term programme. Thank you for your support of the Study Days last term. We now look forward to two study days and one evening meeting, all on richly contrasting themes.

On Saturday 6 November we explore some aspects of drawing from the living waters of the desert. We are happy to welcome Sr Benedicta SLG, writer, translator and one of the oldest friends of St Theosevia's, to speak on St Cuthbert and St Guthlac in Anglo-Saxon England and the inspiration they drew from St Anthony of Egypt. Dr Elena D-Vasilescu presents iconography inspired by *The Ladder*, the classic work of St John Climacus of Sinai on abandoning vices and acquiring virtues. We go to the Holy Land in a remarkable film, both spiritual and archaeological, on the Baptism site identified by Byzantine pilgrims as the place of St John the Baptist, which today is experiencing rediscovery and revival.

On the evening of Thursday 11 November at 8.15pm in St John's College, the Imam and the Pastor, whose film on their work together in northern Nigeria has become something of a modern classic, will be present in person to show and discuss the new film on their peacemaking and peacebuilding methodology. Don't miss this unique opportunity.

On 27 November we are glad to welcome two writers, Anglican and Orthodox, contributors to the Cambridge volume, *Dostorsky and the Christian Tradition*, to explore the thought of Dostoevsky, a rich mine of reflection on the meaning of Christian life and belief amid the complexities, struggles and suffering of this world.

Saturday, 6 November, 10.30am – 4pm

Drawing from Wellsprings in the Desert

with Dr Benedicta Ward SLG, Dr Elena Ene D-Vasilescu, Revd Dr Liz Carmichael, and the film 'The Baptism of Jesus Christ: discovering Bethany beyond the Jordan'

Sr Benedicta: 'Cuthbert, Guthlac and the Life of St Antony': Christians far from Egypt have drawn inspiration from the *Life* of St Antony, including England's two most popular pre-Conquest hermit saints: Cuthbert of Lindisfarne (c.634-687) and Guthlac (c.673-714) whose hermitage in the fens became the Abbey of Crowland. **Dr Elena Vasilescu:** 'St John Climacus of Sinai and the Ladder of Spiritual Ascent in Iconography': a pictorial exploration of this formative text for Orthodox monasticism, the work of 'St John of the Ladder', Abbot of St Catherine's monastery, Sinai in the late sixth century. Liz Carmichael introduces Mustafa Gouveneur's film on the archaeological and spiritual rediscovery of the **traditional site of Jesus' baptism**, now in the Kingdom of Jordan.

Thursday 11 November at 8.15pm, Auditorium, St John's College

'An African Answer': the Spirituality and Practice of Christian-Muslim Interfaith Peacebuilding.

This is the Oxford première of the new documentary on the peacemaking methodology of 'the Imam and the Pastor' from Kaduna, northern Nigeria, James Wuye and Mohammed Asafa. Made in Kenya during the post-election violence, this film is aimed both at a general audience and to train grassroots peacebuilders. Voice-over by Rageh Omar. **Pastor James and Imam Asafa** will personally introduce the film and lead discussion.

Saturday, 27 November, 10.30am – 4pm

Dostoevsky: Spirituality and Theological Insights

with Canon Professor George Pattison and Mrs Irina Kirillova

A day on the great C19th Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoevsky (1821-1881), a thinker who has been influential in debate about God, and humanity's experience of God, in East and West. **Professor Pattison** speaks on 'Death, Immortality, and Eternal Life'. **Irina Kirillova** gives two talks. 'Spiritual symbolism in Dostoevsky's work' (Dostoevsky is a novelist in the realist tradition but his realism is both physical, concrete and spiritual); and 'The Idiot: Christ Figure or Holy Fool?' (in *The Idiot* Dostoevsky portrays his hero as a 'positively good' Christ-like figure, but such a figure cannot be the hero of a realist novel, so who and what is he?)
