Dear Friends of St Theosevia,

Welcome to the Michaelmas Term 2009 programme. Thank you for your interest and support last term. One memorable highlight was the experiential day when we were blessed with bright sunshine and could use the garden for meditations on sculptures of biblical figures and for walking the Chartres labyrinth.

This coming term we have three study days, each with a distinctive focus. The first is on art in relation to liturgy and spirituality, with Fr John Baggley on the use and theology of icons in worship, Nicholas Mynheer whose paintings and sculptures can be found in many local Anglican churches, and Prof Henry Mayr-Harting whose interest focuses on Romanesque art in the churches of southern France and Spain.

The second day explores the nature of 'New Age' spirituality, the eclectic mix of old and new, western and eastern, that has attracted many of our contemporaries. Simon Small is a priest and writer whose spiritual search led him through the 'new age' towards the Christian contemplative tradition. Dr Miguel Farias has done research based in Oxford on the motivation and experiences of 'new age' pilgrims to Stonehenge and Glastonbury, and of Roman Catholic pilgrims to the Marian shrines at Lourdes and Fatima.

Finally, with Fr Ian, Jane Baun and Dr Twycross, we are invited to reflect on the liturgy, spirituality and practical experience of transition from this life to the life beyond.

We look forward to seeing you, and encourage you to make this programme widely known among your friends and to bring them along. If you have ideas for future topics or speakers, or would like to receive extra newsletters or posters, please let us know.

## **From Stonehenge to Glastonbury : ‘the Human Face of the New Age’ and its Encounter with Christian Contemplative Prayer**

with Revd Simon Small (Glastonbury) and Dr Miguel Farias (Oxford)

What are the attractions of ‘new age’ spirituality, and how can the Christian tradition speak to it? The **Revd Simon Small** came to the Anglican priesthood and to Christian contemplative prayer through personal involvement in ‘New Age’ spirituality. He lives in Glastonbury, where he continues the encounter with those who come there as seekers. “I would like firstly to talk about New Age spirituality as a lived human experience, drawing on my own extensive, on-going involvement. I can then reflect on contemplation in that context.” **Dr Farias**, of the Dept of Experimental Psychology, will talk on his general psychological research on the New Age and about his comparative study of ‘New Age’ and Catholic pilgrimages, focusing on Stonehenge.
